

Summer Safety

Look again! Does it look like another mosquito bite?

Many of you may have seen warnings on Facebook (and other social media sites) with pictures of children's arms and legs that have what looks like a *mosquito bite* and the parent later finds out it was a *tick bite*.





What is a tick?

Ticks are tiny bugs which are related to mites, spiders and scorpions. Ticks feed on the blood of animals and require blood meals at certain times in their development cycle. Feeding can last from hours to days depending on the type of tick.

There are many species of ticks but only a few are known to carry the bacterium responsible for causing Lyme disease. In BC, the most common one to transmit Lyme disease is the Western black-legged tick (Ixodespacificus). What are we doing in BC to watch for and reduce the risk of Lyme disease? The BC Centre for Disease Control works in cooperation with local health authorities to monitor for Lyme disease.

• Children are particularly at risk of getting tick bites due to playing outdoors in grassy or wooded areas. • Pets can bring ticks in from the outside and can get sick from Lyme disease too.

Optimal environmental conditions for ticks are in south coastal BC (i.e., Vancouver Island, Lower Mainland, and Sunshine Coast) and interior BC valley regions. The habitat in these areas is characterized by low-lying vegetation such as high grass and brush, with abundant leaf litter and a nearby water source.

What is Lyme disease?

Lyme disease ("LD") is caused by a bacterium (Borreliaburgdorferi) which can be transmitted to humans through the bite of an infected tick. If left untreated LD can affect the joints, the heart and the nervous system. Most cases of LD can be treated successfully with a few weeks of antibiotics. Early symptoms of LD include:

- A "bulls-eye" rash which spreads outward from the tick bite.
- General symptoms of fever, headache, muscle and joint pains.

If you are concerned about Lyme disease you should speak with a health care professional who can assess your symptoms and make sure you get any tests or treatment you may need.

Apply and reapply for those kids over six months, most sunscreen wears off after three hours. Get parental permission on medical forms to use sunscreen prior to use.




Dehydration and Heat-Related Illnesses

Keeping well hydrated is very important.
Children (and adults) must remember to drink.

Do not wait until a child says he is thirsty before offering fluids. At this point, he is already dehydrated, so be sure to provide plenty of fluids before going outside, while out in the heat and afterwards.

Playing in the hot summer sun means lots of fluid losses, so avoid strenuous activity during peak sun hours (10 am- 6 pm). Look for shade and take lots of breaks. Seek medical attention immediately for any signs of heat-related illness.



Make sure that equipment surfaces are safe. Inspect equipment when you head to a play-ground.

Slides and surfaces that face the sun can quickly heat up, wooden beams and boards can splinter, bolts and nails can loosen.

Magic Banana Ice Cream

Ingredients

2 – 8 ripe bananas, peeled, cut into chunks and frozen overnight (6 to 8 hours)

Remove bananas from the freezer and thaw 5-10 minutes. Place banana chunks in a food processor and puree until you achieve ice-cream consistency. That's it! Seriously! Serve immediately.

Toppings (It's always good to have options!)

- Top with crunchy Cacao nibs
- Top with ½ cup of roasted walnuts (heat in pan for about 5 10 minutes. Watch so they don't burn.)
- · Sprinkle cinnamon
- Drizzle maple svrup
- Drizzle vanilla extract
- Add frozen blueberries/strawberries/raspberries/blackberries/fresh goji berries, or any kind of frozen fruit you like!

Keep fluids accessible and offer them regularly. Watch for warning signs (excessive sweating, muscle cramps, dizziness).
