## **CRAFT IDEAS**

2014 is the year of the horse in the Chinese Zodiac. You can help children make mini horse puppets out of socks and old wooden spoons. The craft information can be found in the following link: <a href="http://www.se7en.org.za">http://www.se7en.org.za</a>

You will need: socks, wooden spoons, felt/fabric scrapes, wool scrapes, buttons, stuffing, scissors, and glue.

- 1. Stuff a sock with stuffing from an old pillow.
- 2. Put eyes, ears, nose, mane and whiskers with fabrics, yarns and buttons.
- 3. Insert a wooden spoon into the stuffed sock and tie a ribbon around the base of the neck.
